has significantly influenced the development of HIV nursing practices in the Philippines. Dr. Calaguas' commitment extends beyond academia into community-based HIV care, where he provides essential counseling, testing, and educational services through various civil society and community based organizations. As a trustee of the Philippine Society of Sexual and Reproductive Health Nurses, Inc., and co-chair of the Global Committee for the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care, he has been a driving force in advocating for inclusive healthcare and advancing the role of nurses in the global fight against HIV.

This prestigious award recognizes an ACLPN, ACRN or AACRN who exemplifies excellence in HIV/AIDS nursing and advances the mission of the HIV/AIDS Nursing Certification Board. This award is voted upon by the HANCB board.

Andrew Komensky, RN, BNS, MBA, ACRN, CIC



Andrew “Drew” Komensky, MBA, BSN, RN, ACRN, CIC, has been a member of the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care since 1999. He co-founded the original South Carolina Chapter in 1999. Drew has served on the ANAC Chapters Committee, Bylaws Committee, and Conference Committee and served as Chair of Chapters and the Chair of the 25th Anniversary Conference Committee during his tenure. He also served as ANAC Secretary for two terms. Drew was awarded the ANAC Lifetime Achievement Award in 2012, and currently is a long-time

member of the Rhode Island Chapter of ANAC, where he advocates for members to become certified.

In 2004, Drew received his ACRN certification and in 2019, he was elected to the HIV/AIDS Nursing Certification Board (HANCB) where he served as Treasurer until mid-2024. When HANCB began the process to re-envision the HIV Certification process several years ago, Drew was the driving force to ensure Licensed Practical/Vocational Nurses received the long overdue recognition so richly deserved for their years of competence, expertise, and care for people living with HIV. As a result of the work of the revisioning team, the ACLPN designation was created. Since its inauguration, there are now 53 ACLPNs.

This award is given to a current, or previously, certified nurse for outstanding lifetime accomplishments that have enhanced the Certification board. The award is recommended by the HANCB president to the board of directors for approval and is given at the board’s discretion.

Rasheeta Chandler, PhD, RN, FNP-BC, FAANP, FAAN



Rasheeta Chandler, PhD, RN, FNP-BC, FAANP, FAAN is an Associate Professor at Emory University, Nell Hodgson Woodruff School of Nursing. She also holds an adjunct professorship at Morehouse School of Medicine and a past visiting professorship at University of California, San Francisco (UCSF), Center For AIDS Research [CFAR].

Throughout her career as a researcher, academician, and clinician, she has focused on promoting optimal reproductive health, protective sexual behavior, and STI/HIV prevention

among Black women and other women of color. Her research addresses the critical need for interventions in this population, which faces disproportionately high rates of inferior sexual and reproductive health outcomes, including maternal mortality and STI/HIV transmission. Specifically, she focuses on digital approaches to promote STI/HIV prevention and to combat maternal mortality among Black women, exploring how new forms of technology and communication might support this population's sexual and reproductive health. Her focus on Black women is part of her broader commitment to reducing health disparities among underserved populations, including rural communities. In addition, she is committed to building collaborative relationships between researchers and community members (through community-based participatory research design and human-centered design, for instance). Her contributions as a researcher, clinician, and faculty member are all directed toward these goals.

This award recognizes an outstanding article published in the Journal of the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care during the period from July 1 - June 30 of the year preceding ANAC's annual conference. The award acknowledges a significant contribution to the literature, the science of caring and nursing interventions in the HIV epidemic. The JANAC editorial board makes nominations and selections for this award and it is funded by the journal's publisher.

JJ Jackson, MA, NCC, LCPC, LPC



JJ Jackson, MA, NCC, LCPC, LPC, is a 2nd-year doctoral student at the University of Rochester's School of Nursing, focusing on promoting psychiatric and sexual health outcomes among Black sexual and gender-diverse communities domestically and abroad. Clinically, JJ is a licensed psychotherapist supporting clients along the East Coast. Previously, JJ served as a federal Project Officer overseeing the dissemination of the Ryan White HIV/AIDS program before entering the PhD program at the University of Rochester.

JJ is developing a line of inquiry that seeks to investigate multilevel determinants of health-seeking behaviors among Black and Hispanic males who have interfaced with the criminal justice system. Specifically, JJ is interested in studying how structural racism, mental and behavioral health, and provider relationships influence pathways of health-seeking to develop salient interventions at the structural and systemic levels for this population. JJ aspires to pursue independent sexual health research and contribute to reducing disparate sexual health and psychiatric-related outcomes among Black communities through work in federal and state-level health policy.

This fellowship recognizes a member of a historically underrepresented racial or ethnic minority group in nursing or another health-related discipline who has a genuine interest in HIV/AIDS care. The recipient will establish a mentor/mentee relationship with an ANAC member that will continue throughout the fellowship experience. Fellowship winners will present a summary of their experience at the DEI Committee meeting at the ANAC Annual Conference.

Research Impact Recognition Award

Pamela Kohler, PhD, MPH, RN



Pamela Kohler, PhD, MPH, RN, is a Professor in the Department of Child, Family, and Population Health Nursing and the Department of Global Health at the University of Washington. She holds a PhD in Nursing Science and an MPH in Health Services from the University of Washington. Her clinical expertise includes HIV care, disaster response, and emergency nursing. She has served on the ANAC Research Committee and the JANAC editorial board.

Throughout her academic scholarship, Dr. Kohler has held a sustained commitment to improving access to health information and high-quality health care for adolescents and young adults. She develops and evaluates health services interventions, aiming to improve adolescent engagement in HIV care and prevention. She has led multiple studies using standardized patient actors to assess and enhance the quality of care, and to destigmatize health care interactions, for young people in South Africa and Kenya. Working with the International Training and Education Center for Health, she has also directed training in field epidemiology and quality improvement, and has conducted evaluations of HIV policies and programs in Eastern and Southern Africa. She currently leads an NINR-funded T32 training program to develop promising investigators in global health and health equity-oriented research.

This award recognizes an outstanding current ANAC member who has made a significant contribution through research regarding individuals and communities affected by HIV and the quality of care provided to them. Contributions may be reflected in scholarship and/or by the implemented impact of the research on HIV nursing care and individuals and communities affected by HIV.

Joanne Ruiz Achievement for Excellence in Clinical Practice in HIV

Jennifer Peters Sobolik, MSN, CNP, FNP-C, AACRN, AAHIVS



Jenn Sobolik, MSN, CNP, FNP-C, AACRN, AAHIVS, is an HIV-Certified Family Nurse Practitioner at an FQHC in rural western South Dakota. She is the NP for the Sexual and Reproductive Health Clinic at Complete Health where she provides HIV, Hepatitis C, and routine STI testing, treatment, and prevention services along with women's health care. In 2017, Jenn piloted an HIV clinic where PLWH receive comprehensive HIV services in a primary care setting. In this role, she cares for patients who drive as far

as 3 hours to receive HIV care, and the clinic has served more than 100 patients since it opened. She started Black Hills AIDS Walk to increase HIV awareness in her rural community and takes pride in educating others to decrease stigma. Jenn participated in ANAC's HIV & Aging Scholarship Program in 2023, and she is a member of ANAC's Rural and Policy Committees. She credits her HIV program's success to the amazing team of nurses who support her and to her greatest mentors, Pat Daoust and Justin Alves, who empowered her to find her voice as an HIV advocate. She is grateful to have a wonderful team that shares her mission.

This award is named in honor of Joanne Ruiz (1949-1991), one of the first nurses in the United States to become infected with HIV through occupational exposure. Despite this, she continued as an HIV/AIDS nurse and was admired by her colleagues for her compassionate care and non-judgmental respect for individuals living with HIV/AIDS. This award recognizes an outstanding ANAC nurse clinician who brings knowledge, skill and caring to people with HIV infection and their loved ones.

Dr. Jennifer Belfry is a Family Nurse Practitioner and Certified HIV Specialist with 10 years of experience caring for patients living with HIV. She graduated from Columbia University School of Nursing with her BSN/ MSN and completed her Doctorate in Nursing Practice at University of Massachusetts, Boston with a focus on improving HIV screening in young adults and adolescents.

Jennifer has worked in primary care, FQHCs, and HIV medicine for 8 years before joining Q Care Plus in 2022, a telehealth HIV PrEP and HIV care practice. She is a Clinician Lead and heads the Q Care Link HIV Program at Q Care Plus. She is enthusiastic about ending the HIV epidemic and expanding access to quality care for everyone. An avid baker and trail runner, she resides in Rhode Island with her dog, 2 kids, and writer husband.

This award is named in honor of Frank Lamendola (1950-1998), an ANAC nurse who lived openly with HIV/AIDS for 16 years. He was an exemplary leader in HIV/AIDS nursing care, combining clinical nursing expertise with scholarly and administrative leadership and vision to impact the care of people living with HIV/AIDS. This award recognizes an outstanding nurse who has taken on a major leadership role in HIV research, education, professional services or scholarly activities. The recipient is a nurse who brings vision, administrative abilities and commitment to their position. The award is given to the nurse who has had significant and far-reaching impact on AIDS care nurses and people living with HIV.

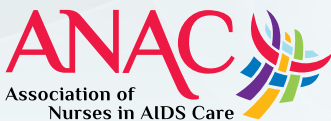

Sheryl Lee Ralph



For 2024, the ANAC Board of Directors has selected Emmy-winning actress Sheryl Lee Ralph as the recipient. She is a prominent advocate for HIV/AIDS awareness and prevention through her work with the DIVA Foundation. Ms. Ralph founded the nonprofit DIVA Foundation in 1990 to honor friends during the early days of the AIDS epidemic. The foundation's mission is to raise awareness and funds for organizations that support the LGBTQ+ community and people living with HIV/AIDS. She has been speaking out about HIV/AIDS since 1983, when she

was in the original Broadway cast of *Dream Girls*. She has been inspired to raise awareness by her experiences with AIDS in the theater community in New York in the 1980s and at Harlem Hospital.

Particularly notable this year, Sheryl Lee Ralph produced the documentary short *Unexpected*, which follows two young mothers who travel the U.S. to share information and supplies with newly diagnosed mothers. The film was produced in partnership with SisterLove, an organization that supports Black women living with HIV. It is being shown at ANAC2024 and will include a post film discussion with one of the women in the film, Masonia Traylor.

This award is given to an individual who (or organization that) has made a significant contribution to public policy or community service. The awardee is selected by the ANAC board of directors. The award is given at the board's discretion.

Vincent Guilamo-Ramos, PhD, MPH, LCSW, RN, ACRN



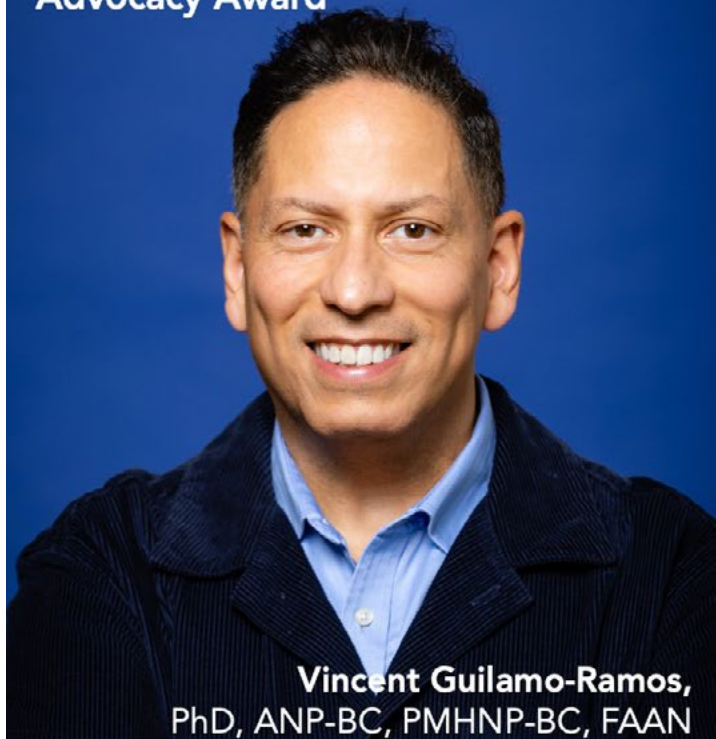
Dr. Vincent Guilamo-Ramos is Executive Director of the Institute for Policy Solutions and Endowed Professor at the Johns Hopkins School of Nursing in Washington DC. He is a nurse practitioner and nurse scientist with clinical and research specialization in HIV prevention and treatment for Latino adolescents and young adults. He served as a member of the NASEM committee that drafted the groundbreaking Ending Unequal Treatment report. He is a regular contributor to leading health scientific journals. He has been funded by NIH,

CDC, and federal agencies for community-based Latino focused health research. He has served on numerous federal advisory committees and is a board member of UnidosUS, the Latino Commission on AIDS and the Power to Decide.

This award is presented by ANAC and Until There's A Cure Foundation to an ANAC member whose work focuses on improving the lives of vulnerable persons or communities, influences policy at a local, state, national or international level and whose drive, motivations and passion affect change.

Lucy Bradley-Springer Excellence in HIV Prevention Award

Jillian Pintye, RN, MPH, PhD



Dr. Jillian Pintye (she/her), RN, MPH, PhD, is a nurse-scientist and Associate Professor in the Departments of Global Health and Biobehavioral Nursing and Health Informatics at the University of Washington. She is also affiliated with the International Clinical Research Center (ICRC) and the Global Center for Integrated Health of Women, Adolescents, and Children (Global WACH) and is a Research Associate with the Botswana Harvard Health Partnership. Her research focuses on HIV and STI prevention and treatment, particularly within maternal child health and family planning settings. Dr. Pintye

is engaged in a suite of studies related to pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) for HIV prevention among young cisgender women and pregnant populations in Kenya and Botswana, including pharmacokinetic evaluations, randomized clinical trials (RCTs), prospective cohort studies, and qualitative and implementation science evaluations. Prior to graduate school, Dr. Pintye was a Peace Corps Volunteer in Botswana, where she developed a passion for HIV and STI prevention among pregnant people and their children.

This award recognizes a nurse who has made significant and outstanding contributions to the prevention of the spread of HIV infection.

Michael V. Relf, PhD, RN, ACNS-BC, AACRN, FAAN, is the Interim Dean and Mary T. Champagne Distinguished Professor of Nursing at the Duke University School of Nursing and a Professor at the Duke Global Health Institute. He is a past-president of the HIV/AIDS Nursing Certification Board. During his tenure at HANCB he led the national taskforce that developed the examination blueprint for the AACRN examination. For the last five years, he has served as the editor-in-chief of the Journal of the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care. ANAC previously

recognized his contributions with the Frank Lamendola Achievement Award for Nursing Leadership in HIV Care (2003), the Spirit of Nursing Award for Excellence in Mentoring (2005) and the Researcher Recognition Award (2017). He earned his PhD in nursing from Johns Hopkins University and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing and the Academy of Nursing Education.

Lifetime Achievement Award

Joachim Voss, RN, PhD, ACRN, FAAN



Joachim Voss, RN, PhD, ACRN, FAAN, is an expert in HIV-related symptom science and was the first nurse scientist to develop a gene expression tool to study gene expression related to fatigue in HIV. Fatigue in HIV and cancer is a highly stressful experience. His research has contributed significantly to the identification of moderators and mediators in HIV and cancer-related fatigue, the identification of basic mechanisms of fatigue in skeletal muscle, CD4 cells, and fat tissue, and the translation of best practices into evidence-

based HIV symptom management guidelines, and evidence-based exercise recommendations for older adults living with HIV.

Joachim received his undergraduate and Master's training in Germany and a PhD from the University of California in San Francisco. After a three-year postdoctoral fellowship at the National Institutes of Health, he was appointed as an Assistant Professor at the University of Washington. After being promoted and tenured, he became the Director of the Evidence-based Practice Institute at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland. During the COVID epidemic, he became chair of the University Faculty Senate and Director of the PhD Program.
